Our Pastor's Message

The Physical Resurrection

In the Gospel, Jesus appears to the disciples. The disciples are startled and terrified. Jesus says he is not a ghost. He is real. He is flesh and bone and he asks for something to eat. Jesus is showing the disciples that the resurrection is a physical reality. It is a real thing. Not a hypothetical thing. Have you experienced the physical reality of the resurrection.

The problem with the average person who is sleepwalking through life is that they put the physical resurrection into only the afterlife. The resurrection is something to be experienced now. Many people choose not to die to themselves. They choose the darkness. Yet if they would just die to themselves, they could experience such a greater life now. When we die to our selfishness, we have such a greater experience of communion with one another.

I was talking to this one person (I have her permission to share) who said she was experiencing this emptiness in her life. She felt like she was going in the wrong direction. She began to search and she found our parish. She searched deeper and found the RCIA (the process of becoming Catholic). The RCIA opened her eyes. She began to share what she was experiencing in the RCIA with her husband who had never been baptized. She chose to get confirmed and he was baptized at the Easter Vigil. The whole experience was life changing. Both her and her husband had risen from the dead. You can physically meet and touch these people.

Another man had built up such a great business for 20 years. He had everything: houses, cars, boats, whatever he wanted. He was not happy. His business collapsed and he lost everything. He could have become bitter, but he decided to let go and to embrace what was happening. He simplified everything. He began to turn to God. He found the work he wanted to do. He finally had time for his family. He now is happy and has such a deep relationship with God. This is someone who was dead. He is now the living embodiment of the resurrection.

The resurrection is a physical thing both now and later. Have you taken the deep dive into life? Have you truly turned your will and your life over to God? It is a scary choice, isn't it? Will he catch me? I know it works for me. This is what scripture tells us. There are all these witnesses of the physical resurrection. Reach out to God and take his hand.


