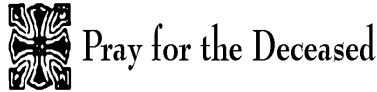

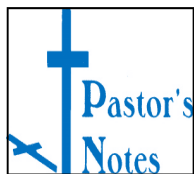

**A HAPPY EASTER SUNDAY TO YOU ALL!** Easter is one of my favorite days of the whole year, not only because the weather is usually beautiful, not only because it's a great time for families to gather, but because it celebrates what is at the heart of our faith as Catholic Christians: that God loved us enough to have his Son die for us on a cross but also that, by means of His Son's death and Resurrection, we have become His sons and daughters as completely as Jesus is!! In fact, this is what every Mass celebrates. Put simply, every Mass, especially Sunday Masses, is East-

er! Below, you will find a prayer titled "**Stay with me, Lord,**" a prayer composed by St. Padre Pio (1887-1968), a prayer which Archbishop-emeritus Robert Carlson shared with us at last week's Parish Mission. It's a prayer that makes that link between Easter and every Sunday Mass to be so clear:

*Stay with me, Lord, for it is necessary to have You present so that I do not forget You. You know how easily I abandon You.*

*Stay with me Lord, because I am weak, and I need Your strength, so that I may not fall so often.*

*Stay with me Lord, for You are my life, and without You, I am without fervor.*

*Stay with me Lord, for You are my light, and without you, I am in darkness.*

*Stay with me Lord, to show me Your will.*

*Stay with me Lord, so that I hear Your voice and follow You.*

*Stay with me Lord, for I desire to love you very much, and always be in Your Company.*

*Stay with me Lord, if You wish me to be faithful to You.*

*Stay with me Lord, for as poor as my soul is, I want it to be a place of consolation for You, a nest of Love.*

*Stay with me, Jesus, for it is getting late, and the day is coming to a close, and life passes, death, judgment, eternity approach. It is necessary to renew my strength, so that I will not stop along the way and for that, I need You.*

*It is getting late and death approaches. I fear the darkness, the temptations, the dryness, the cross, the sorrows. O how I need You, my Jesus, in this night of exile.*

*Stay with me tonight, Jesus, in life with all its dangers, I need You. Let me recognize You as Your disciples did at the breaking of bread, so that the Eucharistic Communion be the light which disperses the darkness, the force which sustains me, the unique joy of my heart.*

*Stay with me Lord, because at the hour of my death, I want to remain united to you, if not by Communion, at least by grace and love.*

*Stay with me Jesus, I do not ask for divine consolation because I do not merit it, but the gift of Your presence, oh yes, I ask this of You.*

*Stay with me Lord, for it is You alone I look for, Your Love, Your Grace, Your Will, Your Heart, Your Spirit, because I love You and ask no other reward but to love You more and more.*

*With a firm love, I will love You with all my heart while on earth and continue to love You perfectly during all eternity. Amen.*

**THIS WEEK WE CONTINUE OUR "LIVING JOY" SERIES:  
RULE 5: ENGAGE YOUR BODY IN THE BATTLE FOR JOY**

**Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you . . . ?  
Saint Paul (1 Corinthians 6:19)**

**Questions to consider:** 1. Consider your sleep, diet, exercise and general health routines. What is good and what needs improvement? 2. Are your dignity and identity reflected in how you carry yourself? Why or why not? 3. How do you feel after you exercise? How do you incorporate exercise into your daily routine? If not, *when* and *where* will you start to? 4. What's your biggest obstacle to healthier eating? 5. Smiling doesn't come easily for everyone. Does it come naturally for you? Why?

**The Challenge:** 1. Keep it simple. Set one, easy to achieve goal for the week to improve the care of your body. 2. Practice sitting and standing LIKE A BOSS. 3. Go ahead. Smile more. 4. Set when and where you plan to work out and just show up! 5. Do an examination of kitchen. Come up with 3 foods you need to get rid of. 6. Try to sleep more and reflect on how that impacts your overall mood.

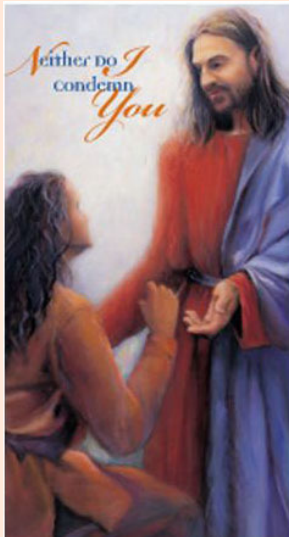

On the Second Sunday of Easter, April 16, 2023, the Church celebrates the Sunday of Divine Mercy. It provides an important opportunity to share Christ's message of mercy, especially with those who suffer because of their participation in one or more abortions. By the age of 45, as many as 1 in 3 women have had an abortion, and a similar number of men and family members have been involved. Many feel that abortion is "the unforgivable sin." They need to hear that, through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, God forgives every sin of a repentant heart, even the sin of abortion. In fact, Jesus' message to St. Faustina is that the greater the sinner, the greater the right to His mercy.

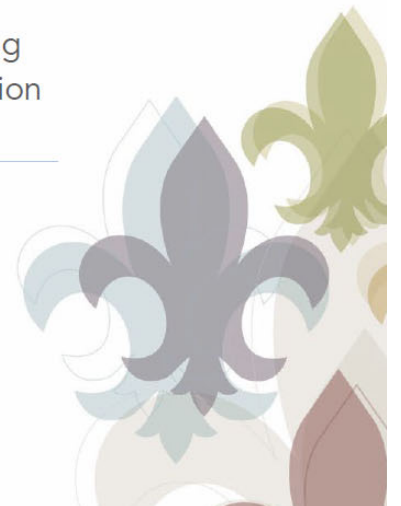

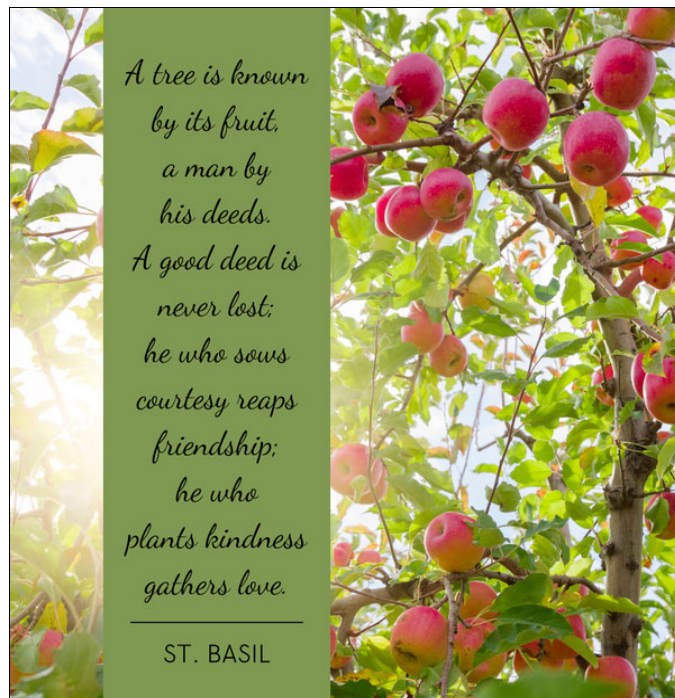
