

My Theological Manifesto

Let's talk about primitive theology. The first reading is about Abraham and Isaac and about God stopping Abraham from sacrificing Isaac. This is primitive theology. This is how primitive man solved the problem of evil. Where does this whole idea come from? There are all kinds of cataclysms in this world, earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, tsunamis, hurricanes, to name a few that kill thousands of people at a time. If you look at primitive religion, the logic is that for some reason God must be angry at us. We must have sinned or did something to incur god's wrath. So this is the basic equation. Offer something to appease (atone) the angry god and soothe his temper for the future. So then came the sacrifices of the harvest. That's not working. We need to be more dramatic, let's sacrifice animals. Still not good enough. Bad things are happening. Let's offer up people. Still not good enough. Let's offer up our children. After all God is an angry god. There has got to be some way to control this angry, hungry, violent god. Most people still use this theology. Jesus had to die to fix our transgressions. After all God is an angry God, he needs blood. It's a nice equation. God is angry. Jesus pleads our cause and offers himself instead. Isn't this true? Isn't this mainline theology. It is even scriptural to some degree.

Let me offer a different theology that is also scriptural, although a minority view, but still accepted within the church. The previous view is the atonement theory. What I think that we can't see which makes sense theologically is that the Father is actually pouring himself into Christ, and through Christ all things came to be, the universe. The Father is pouring himself into Christ, into us. We believe in a trinitarian God where each person pours himself into the other. The Father is not about taking life, but giving life emptying himself, "dying" into Christ, dying into us which is what is giving us life. Think about it, the Father is emptying himself into us in every moment (giving us life). We still have the problem of original sin, but maybe that is the cost so that we could have free will. Why does this make a difference? Jesus is no longer offering himself up to appease an angry father. Rather, he sees what the Father is doing. The Father is pouring himself out in love of us. That is God's love and will. Jesus sees the Father and what he is doing and so chooses to be one with the Father. It is what the Father is doing that gives life. And so Jesus pours himself out like the Father for us. He gives life. What seems to end life gradually brings greater life for one and for all, the resurrection. As Jesus says numerous times, he is only doing what the Father is doing. Their will has become one.

Jesus saves us because he is the blueprint for how to live, how to love. Life is living, dying and rising. Nothing changed on calvary. God was always a loving, forgiving God. No, Jesus revealed what was true since the beginning of time. God has been pouring his life out for us. God the Father is not an angry blood-thirsty God of revenge. Jesus did not come to change the mind of an angry Father, but to change our mind about God. Is it any wonder that most people where afraid and unable to relate to an angry Father (still are)? Now we have a safe God who will do anything for us. Do you seek to be one with God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit? Then it is about turning our will over to God as Jesus and the Father turned their will over to us. I believe Jesus caught visions of the Father's love along the way. The biggest of that is what happens in the Gospel today, the transfiguration. This is why he comes down the mountain, to make God's love a reality. To show us the pattern, living, dying and rising.

I want to show one shining example, Alexei Navalny. I hope you all know Alexei Navalny. Alexei died fighting a tyrant. His way was non-violent. He died to change the people of Russia's mind. Apparently, Alexei was an atheist. But he had a conversion along the way. He did not die to appease an angry Father. He died to change Russia's mind about love. He chose to be one with God. He chose to be Christ in his own unique way, our goal. Now our life may not be as dramatic, but we are all called to turn our will over to God, to Love who is God. It happens in many small ways and sometimes in big ways. We are all called to die to our selfishness. Isn't this what Lent is about, how we can be more one with Christ. Remember it's not sacrifice that God seeks, but mercy (the words of Jesus).






# Tuesday, February 27 @ 7:00 pm




